Summary minutes

Opening karakia

Welcome and opening

- Competition law reminder
- Insights from Australian Sustainable Finance Institute (ASFI) sustainable finance summit

Discussed Whole-of-farm activity (WOFA)

- The TEG reviewed proposals for both green and transition WOFAs:
 - Members unanimously supported retaining a green WOFA, with a stringent threshold of 1 tonne of carbon dioxide equivalent per hectare (tCO2e/ha), based on net/absolute emissions
 - Members agreed on developing a transition WOFA with two pathways (both based on emissions intensity measures):
 - Option A: An 'upper quartile' approach to recognise efficient farmers who cannot yet meet the green threshold
 - Option B: a 2% emissions reduction target to recognise farmers making continuous improvements – considered aspirational yet achievable and subject to future updates as better data becomes available



- Members noted challenges such as regional variation, mixed farming systems, and data gaps, and requested that Option A be redrafted to work for mixed farming
- Members confirmed all current exclusions should remain, but requested a note be added to the criteria regarding the ability to rewet peatlands, in order to demonstrate that options exist for farmers with small areas of drained peatland
- The TEG highlighted that both green and transition WOFAs should be recognised as taxonomyaligned.

Discussed other activity-specific proposals for climate change mitigation substantial contribution (SC) criteria

- The TEG reviewed activity-specific proposals and agreed on:
 - Thresholds for nutrient and livestock management remain as written, with efficient farms addressed through WOFA
 - Efficacy thresholds removed for methane/nitrous oxide inhibitors; inclusion in Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI)'s emissions calculator or Agricultural Compounds and Veterinary Medicines (ACVM) approval will be sufficient
 - Efficient vehicles/equipment only eligible where no electric commercial alternatives exist; no sunset clause will apply for now, but this will be revisited when transport sector criteria are developed
 - Removal of the 'transition exotic plantation forest to indigenous ecosystem' and 'onsite wood processing' activities from the climate change mitigation criteria – though there is interest in supporting transition forests through climate change A&R criteria and/or within the standard afforestation, reforestation and rehabilitation criteria
 - Continued development of criteria for a standalone biomass activity, for inclusion in the agriculture, forestry and other land use (AFLOU) and future energy sector taxonomies

Noted forestry definitions had been revised by cross TEG/TAG forestry sub-group Do no significant harm (DNSH) revisions

- The TEG agreed to adopt the Australian Taxonomy language for the circular economy generic DNSH
- The TEG provided direction for CBI to update the pollution prevention and control generic DNSH
- The TEG endorsed the additional DNSH to protect arable land, with language as drafted

DNSH and minimum social safeguards (MSS) requirements

- The TEG agreed that MSS and DNSH will be optional in the near term to support uptake but are expected to become mandatory later (with exemptions for small businesses)
- They also agreed that the climate change mitigation SC criteria should incorporate necessary exclusions, particularly in forestry, to provide necessary protections while DNSH is optional
- The TEG emphasised the importance of clear communication on the temporary nature of optional requirements and called for an implementation strategy to support uptake and piloting
